
Non-Violent Arrest Actions Disrupt “Business as Usual” in San Francisco & Los Angeles

Busloads of Northern California UC workers and community supporters met at UCSF and took over the street in front of UCSF Medical Center.

4/3/08: On the eve of the 40th anniversary of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., hundreds of AFSCME members and community supporters honored his life's work through non-violent civil disobedience to demand justice at UC.

More than 75 people blocked streets and were arrested in San Francisco and Los Angeles to send UC the message:

“We are serious about winning a fair contract that will help our patients, students and families!”

Participants were willing to take this serious action because UC isn't doing enough to fix the recruitment and retention problems. If they did it would help us to provide better patient care and student services.

Our actions expose UC's misplaced priorities and keep the pressure on while we continue to negotiate during the impasse procedure, where we hope to work out an agreement.
